The NY-LCB Dam Task Force promotes and facilitates the restoration of stream connectivity and function in the New York portion of the Lake Champlain Basin. It is a cooperative effort among federal and state agencies, private organizations, and individuals.

Description

The NY-LCB Dam Task Force is a collaboration of partners that coordinate efforts related to aquatic organism passage in the New York portion of the Lake Champlain Basin. The task force serves as a forum for parties interested in restoring aquatic organism passage through the modification or removal of dams and other barriers that no longer function as intended and/or impede natural stream function. The group shares best practice information to restore connectivity to historic species ranges while preserving cultural resources and interpretation. The NY-LCB Dam Task Force first met in May, 2019 and is modeled after the successful Vermont Dam Task Force.

- The Educational Materials Sub-group is working to create a print and online brochure about dam removal.
- Another sub-group is looking at opportunities to restore connectivity on the lower Saranac River which has three dams.
- LCMM's High School Watershed Science Apprenticeship Program is focusing on dams in the basin through a LCBP E&O grant and the workgroup members will be acting as a resource for the student participants.
